







Vivaad Voices: Where Ideas Took Flight

A clip from the movie Inside Out was shown to introduce the concept of emotions—feelings like happiness, sadness, anger, or fear that arise from internal or external experiences. The facilitators explained that emotional intelligence is the ability to understand, express, and manage one's own emotions while being sensitive to the feelings of others. The discussion highlighted its importance in daily life and introduced students to the five core components: self-awareness, selfregulation, motivation, empathy, and social skills. The session concluded by helping students identify traits of high and low emotional intelligence and how practicing emotional intelligence leads to stronger relationships and personal growth.

Summer Sparks: A Glimpse into Holiday Project


Summer was a blend of laughter, quiet moments, and small discoveries. Now, I'm back - refreshed and ready for the next chapter.










BHAASHA, VIGYAAN, GANIT SAB KUCH ZINDA HAI YAHAAN!














New Faces, Shared Purpose: Welcoming Leaders in Learning




