IGNITING YOUNG MINDS: AI & ROBOTICS WITH CONCENTRIX




TEA, TALES & TIMELESS BOND:- RUSKIN BOND

"Battle of the Brains: The Ultimate House Quiz Face-Off"





TAKE WHAT YOU NEED, WHEN YOU NEED IT.

On 15th May 2025, a special awareness session on washroom hygiene was conducted for adolescent girls of Grades IX and X at LPSSS by the Health Educator and School Counsellor. The session aimed to emphasize the importance of personal hygiene and maintaining cleanliness in shared washroom spaces. Key issues such as improper disposal of sanitary products, lack of handwashing, wet floors, and unhygienic toilet seats were addressed, highlighting how these factors can lead to infections, discomfort, and embarrassment. Students were guided on the correct methods of sanitary disposal, the importance of regular handwashing with soap, keeping washroom floors dry, and promptly reporting maintenance concerns. The session also fostered a sense of shared responsibility among the students to maintain clean and hygienic facilities for the well-being and dignity of all. Through such initiatives, the school continues to promote health, confidence, and a safe environment for every girl.









On 20th May 2025, an impactful awareness workshop on the dangers of substance abuse—particularly tobacco—was conducted for Grades 9 and 10 at Lotus Petal Senior Secondary School. Held on the first floor of the K Block, the session was facilitated by Health Educator Ms. Bipasa Giri and School Counsellor Ms. Poornima Sharma. Themed around the powerful quote, "Say no to tobacco – Breathe clean, live green," the workshop aimed to educate students about the harmful effects of tobacco and empower them to make healthy, informed life choices. Through interactive discussions and real-life narratives, students explored the various forms of substance abuse, the consequences of tobacco use on mental and physical health, and its impact on academic performance. Teachers and mentors shared personal stories from their youth, illustrating how they overcame peer pressure and resisted addictive substances. These narratives resonated deeply with the students, making the subject more relatable and inspiring. Activities such as an engaging quiz helped debunk common myths about substance use, while a group pledge reinforced their commitment to clean and conscious living. Flip the Script: Competency-Based Learning in Action - Teacher's Workshop



WHEN DUTY CALLS: STUDENTS STEP INTO PREPAREDNESS










Mock Drill on May 7th

SHARPENING ST SKILLS WITH ASSET





PARENT TEACHER MEETING





Stillness Between the Bells: Meditation










Mapping the Mind, Mastering the Chapter!









Hands-On, Minds-On: Enriching Every Chapter
