Truly a quack-tastic race full of smiles and joy!








Little Stars, Big Celebrations!





Discipline with Dignity: Say No to Corporal Punishment





On 28th august, a highly insightful workshop on the Harmful Effects of Corporal Punishment was conducted by Ms. Tamanna Rehman, School Counsellor, for the teaching staff. The session focused on creating awareness about the negative impact of both physical and verbal punishment on children.

Ms. Tamanna explained that while harsh words, physical force, or shaming may seem effective in the short term, they often lead to long-term psychological, emotional, and behavioral issues. Research findings shared in the workshop revealed that children exposed to corporal punishment are more likely to develop aggression, face academic difficulties, and lose trust in teachers.

The workshop emphasized fostering discipline through empathy, respect, and compassion. Practical strategies such as setting clear routines, using non-verbal cues, building trust, and reinforcing positive behavior were discussed.

Teachers were also reminded about the importance of self-care, as a calm and balanced teacher creates a nurturing classroom environment.



On 27th August 2025, a Leadership Development Program on "AI Integration with Education" was conducted by Mr. Azim from Sharda University for our teachers. The insightful session explored how Artificial Intelligence can transform classrooms by making learning more engaging, personalized, and effective. 
Star of the Month: Shining Bright!


