• Inter-House Competitions

The below mentioned activities were conducted:

a) Moral Story Character Portrayal (Grade 2 to 5)

Students participated with a lot of zeal and vigour in the monthly subject enrichment activities. Here are some glimpses of the same.





WORKSHOPS

a) Students Workshop: Effective Communication Skills

The key to success is effective communication. Students in school and even in interpersonal relationships recognise the significance of effective communication. Ms. Pooja Sehgal led a workshop on effective communication skills for students of grade 2 to 8. The goal of the workshop was to teach students how to maximise their interactions in order to demonstrate a strategy for applying communication skills in the environment. Students learned how to



build a shared perspective, change behaviour, and acquire information by communication skills through activity-based learning. The programme proved to be quite beneficial to the students and will undoubtedly aid them in enhancing their communication abilities.

b) Teachers Workshop: Effective Communication Skills

Great teachers create great students. The most essential feature of school-related variables impacting student accomplishment is an inspirational teacher. Paying close attention to developing and strengthening skills in their new and experienced faculty, a workshop was conducted by Ms. Guneet Kaur and Ms. Suman Atri for the teachers on the topic 'Effective Communication Skills' on 2nd November. They enlightened the teachers on the



importance of effective communication, an essential skill in today's world. Teacher communication skills are considered a key to academic success and failure of the students. They shared techniques of effective communication with students by listening, observing, retention, non-verbal communications, being clear and succinct, empathetic and many more. At the end of the session, they invited everyone to play a Chinese whisper game by giving different tongue twisters. Overall, the workshop was really interesting and knowledge-giving. It was a great learning enriching experience.

c) <u>Teachers Workshop : Heartfulness</u> Practice

Lotus Petal Sr. Secondary School strives not only for the development of its students, but also to maximise the potential of its teachers. A 'heartfulness practice' training program was conducted by Rotary Public School. The program was attended by five teachers from our school.



The main objectives of the program were:

- a) Teachers shall learn basic 'Heartfulness' practices to manage their own stress and emotions, and improve the quality of their life. As a result, the teachers will be more relaxed and centered, and will connect more easily with their students in the classrooms.
- b) To develop students' emotional & social quotient along with IQ.

There was an interesting prologue session to begin with where the facilitator involved the participants to relax and meditate as per heartfulness practice and they were given guided relaxation followed by a few minutes of meditation. Participants shared their experience after meditation. A feeling of poise and peace was apparent among the participants. The program was explained through PPTs. The session was enriching and full of creativity.





d) Teachers Workshop: Experiential Learning

A teacher is a learner before he/she is a teacher. The spirit of bettering oneself is what defines an educationist. In this regard, it is essential for teachers to upgrade themselves, attain a set of differential skills, and improve upon practised strategies. Ms. Ruchira Verma led the session on "Experiential Learning" with the assistance of the mentors Ms. Suman Atri and Ms. Guneet Kaur. She assisted instructors in implementing more effective teaching strategies and in organising their classes and activities in order to optimise student learning. All the teachers were divided in pairs and each pair had to perform a short skit. One of them had to teach using the conventional methods, and the other had to teach in a way that made learning enjoyable, incorporated activities, and sparked students' curiosity. The teachers actively participated in the workshop and showed commendable team spirit in planning out activities.
