COMPETITIONS

• Inter-House Competitions

a) Badge Making and Rangoli Making

CLUB FIESTA

a) Science and Analytical Club

Science and Analytical Club activities are aimed to explain, exhibit and demonstrate science to induct observational, logical and analytical approaches among school students. It leads to a scientific attitude among the young students for their life-long learning. When we think of early mathematical learning, we typically think firstly of numbers. But there is a whole other world of mathematics to enjoy and explore and that is the world of shapes! Each day children are exposed to shapes in their environment. They see and interact with them everywhere daily. We want children to see a shape and make a connection. On 28th January the following activities were held so that each child develops an understanding of shapes.

• 2-D shapes using clay and earbuds (Grade 2 to 4)

The tiny hands worked quickly and efficiently. They pounded, squeezed, rolled, and blended the clay to create some amazing geometric 2-D shapes.





• Finding perimeter using earbuds (Grade 5 to 8)

The realistic mathematics approach was applied in this activity to support the learning process of perimeter. Real life context such as graph paper, earbuds was chosen in developing a sequence of learning lines to reach the learning goal of perimeter. The exercise was incredibly interesting.





WORKSHOPS

a) Students Workshop: Emotional Intelligence


Education is the key to unlocking the world, a passport to freedom. Our emotions need to be as educated as our intellect. It is important to know how to feel, how to respond and how to let life in so that it can touch you. It is also exemplary to understand that emotional intelligence is not the opposite, it is not the triumph of heart overhead - it is the unique intersection of both. Emotional intelligence is all about preserving what it is to be humans experiencing emotions, being present, interacting socially. To inculcate 'Emotional Intelligence' and realize its true value, a productive workshop was organized and conducted by Mrs. Pooja Sehgal. The session began with an ice breaker activity that enabled students to understand the real objective of an elaborated session on Emotional Intelligence. Raising our students' beliefs, self-worth and happiness by equipping them with emotional intelligence skills should be the prime goal of our school. It was indeed a great learning experience for students.





a) Students Workshop: Food and Nutrition

Growing children require good nutrition to build healthy bodies and fight diseases. Attitudes towards food are shaped during early school years, forming the basis for future eating habits. In order to inculcate healthy eating habits in children, a training on nutrition for the children was organized by zomato on 27th January. The workshop was conducted in an interactive and fun-filled manner. Through focused lectures children were educated on the importance of correct nutrition required for healthy growth. They were made aware of the main nutrients in food, their importance for the body and for prevention of malnutrition and disease. The concept of junk food and fast food was discussed. A quiz and word-search strengthened the concepts and made learning interesting. Children enjoyed the sessions.





b) Teachers Workshop: Experiential Learning

The session was highly interactive and fun filled as it included varied activities which reiterated the essence of the workshop i.e. learning by doing and then reflecting on the same. The session ended with the principal asserting that in the changing education scenario, teachers need to constantly equip themselves with the latest trends.
